President's Message


I welcome you to Iliff's 2021 Year in Review. As I write, we are looking back on our first Gathering Days since the pandemic began. Our Journey students traveled in from all regions of the United States. It was refreshing to have the campus filled with students. We have just held our first onsite Board of Trustees meeting. Staff and faculty are transitioning back to their offices. When we held our first onsite faculty and staff meeting, it was a springtime all of its own. The laughter and sharing was a warm fresh breeze. We are all enjoying freedom from our little Zoom cells.

This has been a long season of displacement. As unchosen as the pandemic was, we have learned from it. We all have experienced a form of displacement. At a recent board meeting I asked us to reflect on the theme of displacement in light of Iliff's purpose and vision. At Iliff, we are taking stock of the stories of displacement within the world. Whether it is the immense grief from COVID deaths, the movement to exclude LGBTQIA+ persons from the church, political divisions within US culture, racial injustice, or political challenges to higher education curriculum, it is always about human displacement. In this era of displacement, Iliff stands in its full stature when it is about the work of creating place.

It is deep within the calling of Iliff to hold tension with this historic moment. This year the Rev. Dr. Willie Jennings blessed us at our commencement ceremony and later with a series of public conversations. He writes, "But if theological education aims to form people who can gather others together through border-crossing pluralism and God-drenched communion, we can begin to cultivate the radical belonging that is at heart of God's transformative work."

This Year in Review remembers this ongoing work and gives thanks to the ever increasing number of individuals who make gifts to Iliff that create place in this era of displacement. Your gifts have made it possible to increase our scholarship support that strengthens Iliff as an accessible place for new and continuing students to seek degrees in our strong programs and with our excellent faculty. These gifts have supported the Innovation Lab that carries the essence of Iliff's work into new learner relationships. Law professionals engage diversity, equity, and inclusion training. Iliff's consultants engage designers and consumers of artificial intelligence to determine if its products are trustworthy and engineered without racial bias. The Ecojustice Center conference addressed the realities of environmental racism that force migration on marginalized communities. The Institute for Religion, Politics, and Culture takes Iliff into conversation with policy makers who seek to understand the intersections between religion and its potential influences on politics and culture.

In these ways, Iliff seeks to stand in its full stature to create place. Thank you for standing with Iliff.

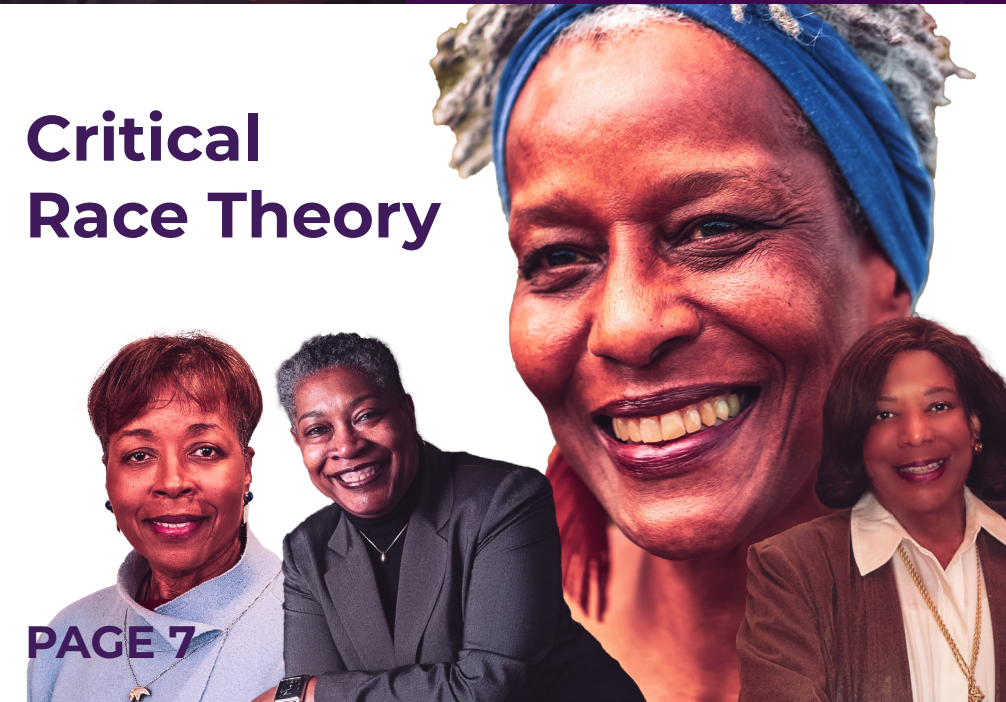

Additionally, the Institute built an advisory board to guide its work and fostered relationships with leaders and influencers in religious and political spaces. In the next school year, the Institute will be launching the Complexified podcast; hosting workshops inside and outside the Iliff community; and facilitating the Religious Equality Caucus, a national caucus of state legislators who meet monthly to support policies that assure rights and equality.



Innovation Lab

Dr. Jeni Rinner joined the Iliff staff in January of 2021 as the new Curriculum Product Development Specialist. Dr. Rinner comes to Iliff from Regis Jesuit High School in Denver, where she taught for over six years. She brings with her considerable skills in developing user-focused educational experiences. In the coming year, Dr. Rinner will be taking the lead on the Innovation Lab's continued efforts in the realm of diversity, equity and inclusion training as well as the TRUST embedded ethics initiative, which will use a scorecard for businesses working in the artificial intelligence sphere.

Dr. Ted Vial

In June of 2020, Dr. Ted Vial, Iliff's Harvey Potthoff Professor of Theology and Modern Western Religious Thought, took on a new title: Vice President of Innovation, Learning, and Institutional Research. Dr. Vial joined the Iliff team in 2005 and continues to bring his expertise to the Iliff community through teaching courses and providing institutional leadership.



Faculty Highlights

Professor Emeritus Jeffrey Mahan

After 26 years of dedicated service to the Iliff School of Theology, the Rev. Dr. Jeffrey Mahan, Ralph E. and Norma E. Peck Professor of Religion & Public Communication, entered a well-deserved retirement to spend more time with his family, particularly his granddaughter, at the end of the 2020-21 academic year.

Dr. Mahan began his teaching career as a theological educator in 1989 and came to Iliff in 1995. For the last twenty-six years, Dr. Mahan taught in the areas of ministry, media and culture for both master's and doctoral students. He also helped Iliff's internship and ministry practice program become an example for other theological schools through his vision and leadership for the Office of Professional Formation. Between 2005 and 2009, he served as the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean of the Faculty. His leadership, scholarship and presence will be missed at Iliff.

In October, Dr. Mahan gave his retirement lecture, "Congregations and other forms of Christian Connection: Church as Network" at Montview Presbyterian Church.

Rev. Dr. Jennings is Associate Professor of Systematic Theology and Africana Studies at Yale University Divinity School. A Calvin College graduate, Dr. Jennings received his M.Div. from Fuller Theological Seminary and his Ph.D. in Religion and Ethics from Duke.

As a systematic theologian, Dr. Jennings teaches in the areas of theology, Black church, and Africana studies, as well as post-colonial and race theory. Writing in the areas of liberation theologies, cultural identities, and anthropology, Dr. Jennings has authored more than 40 scholarly essays and nearly two-dozen reviews, as well as works on academic administration and blog posts.

Dr. Jennings examines the problems of theological education within western education with his book entitled *After Whiteness: An Education in Belonging*, which has already become an instant classic, winning the 2020 Book of the Year award from Publisher's Weekly. During the 2022-2023 academic year, Dr. Jennings will join Iliff in dialogue and learning to advance the 50in5 initiative with faculty, staff and student training and community events.

Dialogues on Social Justice

In October 2020, the Iliff Women's Alliance, along with Kebaya Coaching & Consulting, hosted Dialogues on Social Justice - Black Women Solutionaries, Making Room for All: Equity in Public Education.

This conversation highlighted Black Women Solutionaries leading and advancing racial equity in public education. The panel included: Dr. Rosemarie Allen, Dr. Janiece Mackey, and Dr. Sandy Mason, facilitated by Dr. Carolyn Love.

The Women's Alliance at Iliff is a volunteer committee that was founded to "bring Iliff into the community." The Women's Alliance explores the connections between social justice and spiritual values as they impact the personal and public lives of women.

Critical Race Theory

What it is and Why it Matters



Critical Race Theory has entered the public lexicon and brought political division, school board fights, and battles in higher education. But do the people doing the fighting actually understand what the theory is? In November, the Iliff community heard from Black Women leaders on the history and foundations of Critical Race Theory and discussed the vital need to educate ourselves and others on the legal structures that have built and maintained racism in our society for the past three centuries. Additionally, we explored the spiritual necessity of facing our past so we can imagine new futures. The session panel included Alexi Freeman, Professor of the Practice of Law, Associate Dean of Diversity Equity Inclusion and Director of Social Justice Initiatives at Sturm College of Law; Deborah Richardson, Executive Director and CEO of ACLU-CO; Rev. Dr. Valerie L. Jackson, Senior Pastor at Cameron United Methodist Church; Norma Johnson, Healer/Poet, Writer, Performing Artist, Teacher, Speaker, Consultant and Facilitator; and Dr. Carolyn Love, Educator, Philanthropist, Leadership Trainer and Coach, Owner, Kebaya Coaching ~ Consulting, and Black Women Solutionaries, Inc. The Renewal Conference is Iliff's annual community gathering to share our work, hear timely messages from a variety of experts, and spend time in fellowship. Each year, we focus on a different overall theme which is relevant to our society in those moments, and each day provides content focused on part of the conference theme. In light of the challenges we are all facing, the theme for the 2020-2021 academic year was "Justice."

Due to the pandemic, we shifted the Renewal series to an online format in partnership with faculty, staff, alumni, students, and community members to share how justice powers their work in the world. Over the year, over 350 alumni/ae, students, and friends joined the Renewal series, which featured topics including Storytelling, Music & Justice; Social Enterprise & Justice; Comparative Religion; Environmental Justice; Reproductive Rights; and Mental Health.

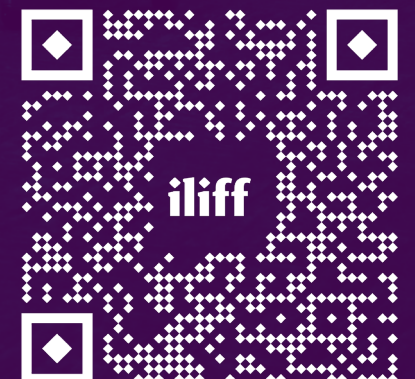

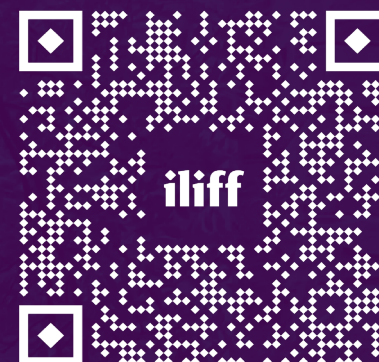

This year, the Iliff community came together to celebrate the life and legacy of Susan Schlessman Duncan. The Schelssman and Ducan families have a long friendship with Iliff, evidenced in classrooms, program funds, and scholarships that bear their names. Sue dedicated much of her time to continuing the legacy of generosity begun by her family, following in the footsteps of her parents and grandparents.

When Sue passed on June 1st, 2019, she made sure her spirit of generosity would continue. Through her estate, she left the largest gift to the institution to date. With this gift, the Board of Trustees chose to launch the Susan Schelssman Duncan Scholarship Matching Campaign, matching any gift to student scholarships beginning June 1st, 2021. This campaign futhers Sue’s legacy of love and support for Iliff students.

As of January 2022, we have successfully completed the first phase of the matching campaign! Thanks to your generous gifts, we have raised over \$500,000 for student scholarships, matched by \$1 million from the Sue Schlessman Duncan legacy gift.

Students of the Year

Katherine Daniels (MDiv '21)

Before coming to Iliff, I exasperated others with a seemingly meandering vocational path. I joined Iliff in 2018 with little understanding of what theological education entailed or what it would bring to my life. It just seemed like another step along the path, framed by a sense that I needed to pause my decades-long career in international development. The uncertainty of where I was headed did not bother me; it left space for growth.

At Iliff, I became especially drawn to embodiment. Where exactly does trauma live in our bodies? What does it mean to become old? Why does Mary live in our imaginations as pious, white, cisgendered, youthful, and virginal? I hurtled through classes, internships, and training programs, racking up qualifications to become any number of things, but what would I become?

My capacity to be curious and stay present with the process grew at Iliff. I served as a chaplain in hospice and hospital rooms to sit quietly, listen, ask questions, hold hands, and pray with those enduring life-changing experiences. I attended to their thoughts and encouraged them to pay attention to their bodies. I returned to international development, bringing a critical perspective to this post-colonial but not yet decolonized work.



Daryl Jerome Walker (MDiv '21)

As the song goes, “we are building up a new world.” As a Christian committed to serving humanity, I facilitate and foster justice in love, show mercy, and honor G*d in all that I do. My Iliff education transformed me, encouraged the Sacred Music Theologian that has always been within me, and empowered me to imagine, see, and engage with the world, replacing the paradigm of “power over [others]” with “power with [others].”

I am a Singing Activist and Sacred Music Theologian who would not be here without the village that surrounded me throughout my theological journey. With eternal gratitude, I thank the faculty of Iliff for always seeing the best in me and voting me as the 2021 Masters Student of the Year. I also thank Dr. Eunjoo Kim and Dr. Cathie Kelsey for selecting me for the Fellowship Seminarian Award.

Over the last year, I have been able to embody sacred music that is influenced by the spirituals and entangled with the values of ministry and the calling of service. In addition to being a candidate for Deacon and Minister of Music and Worship at Park Hill UMC, I am on the Board of the Denver Children's Choir and a member of the Spirituals Project at DU's Lamont School of Music. I find it important to remain close to not only the Methodist family, but also to other faith groups such as the Jewish and Islamic communities. My work continues to bring diverse people together, united in the spirit of giving to those truly in need by living out a legacy of love for humanity.

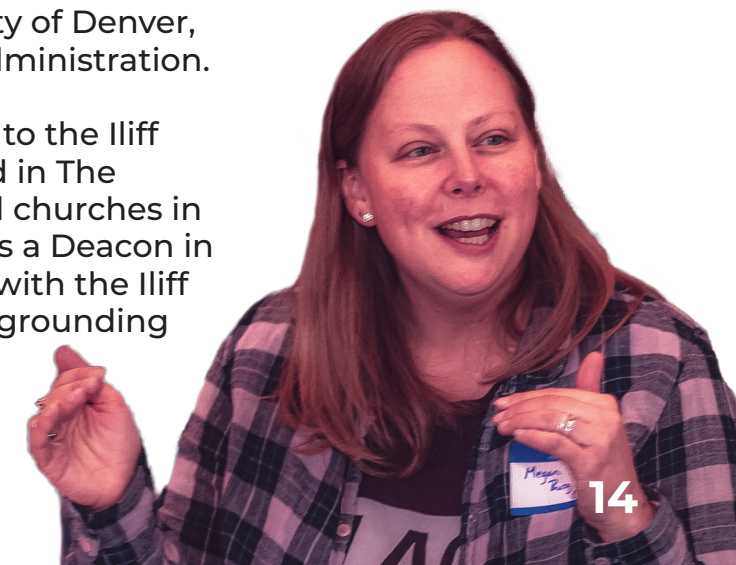
Rev. Megan Burg

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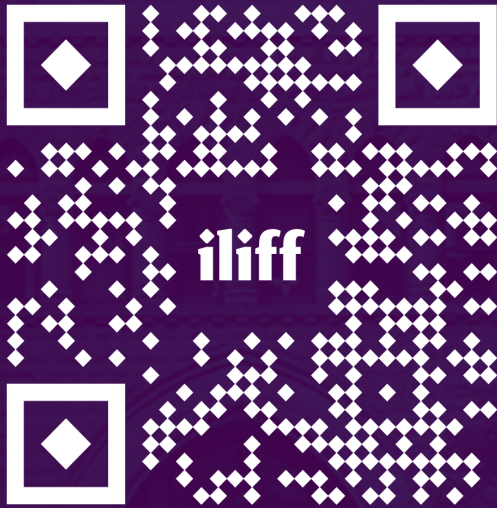
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
