

CELEBRATING SCHOLARSHIP

DR. MIGUEL DE LA TORRE PROFESSOR OF SOCIAL ETHICS AND LATINX STUDIES

Dr. Miguel A. De La Torre is an international scholar, documentarian, novelist, academic author, and scholar activist. The focus of Dr. De La Torre's academic pursuit is social ethics within contemporary U.S. thought, specifically how religion affects race, class, and gender oppression. Since obtaining his doctorate in 1999, he has authored over a hundred articles and published forty-one books.

DR. ALBERT HERNANDEZ ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR OF THE HISTORY OF CHRISTIANITY

Dr. Albert Hernandez has over thirty years of experience in different educational settings as an administrator, curriculum developer, and successful change-agent for organizational management systems. His current writing projects and recent classes focus on medical history and spiritual healing; Italian Renaissance humanism after the Black Death; mysticism in the Spanish Reformation; and the history of social justice.

DR. KATHERINE TURPIN PROFESSOR OF PRACTICAL THEOLOGY AND RELIGIOUS EDUCATION & DIRECTOR OF THE MASTER OF DIVINITY PROGRAM

Interests in how people learn and critically engage with religious traditions, how they disrupt formation into the assumptions and practices of dominant culture, and how they navigate the politics of knowing in diverse communities inform Dr. Turpin's work in religion education and practical theology. Her current research interests include how histories of oppression and structural inequality inform the identity of white women and unlearning and disrupting white supremacy in the practices of education and theological reflection.

BARBARA KELLEY Board of Trustees Member Since 2017

Barbara Kelley has served as president of the Rollie R. Kelley Family Foundation since its inception in 1994. The Foundation, started by her father, a former lliff trustee, continues his mission to enhance business and cultural education along with community needs in the Rocky Mountain region.

We recently had a conversation with Barbara about her long history with lliff and what she loves about being a board member.

Do you have a favorite lliff story that you like to tell people unfamiliar with the organization?

"Dad (Rollie R. Kelley) knew Donald E. Messer, former president of lliff. Don officiated the wedding between my dad and his new wife, Pat, in the lliff Chapel. The signage was so bad that I was late for the wedding! When I sit in the chapel now, I think of Dad's wedding. There wasn't even a sign on the street for lliff at that time."

What is your most important experience as a board member?

"The whole experience is meaningful. There are amazing people on the board, and it's growing, too. We share a common goal to make lliff stronger. We are always looking for people who are interested and committed, who are willing to join the board."

What about lliff gets you excited?

"What always gets me excited about lliff is the students and what they do with their knowledge in the world. Board members who are graduates of lliff are doing amazing work in the world. They're coming back and paying it forward with current students. How lliff expands and grows, and has an awareness of what new students and the world are looking for. It's a small niche and lliff is so creative and committed to students and going forth with the lliffian thoughts and standards. I like what lliff produces."




